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POLICY ON ACTIVE PRACTICE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The College's Registration Regulations, Section 5, require members to report active practice numbers upon completion of their first two years of registration. If they have met the active practice requirements (APR) for this first two-year period, they will then be required to report in five-year increments. Members may report in any given five years. Reporting years may overlap but may not extend beyond five years.

For members who have met the initial 2 year APR, the College may elect to grant equivalency to APR for up to 10 births in any five-year period for activities related to the provision of midwifery care.

For members who have met the initial 2 year APR, and who cannot otherwise meet the active practice requirements, births outside Ontario will be accepted if it can be verified to the College's satisfaction that the care provided substantively equals the care provided within the Ontario model of practice.

If members do not meet the APR or fail to report their active practice numbers, whether in the initial two-year period or in subsequent five-year periods, they will be required to undertake an Individualized Re-qualification Program as designated by the College of Midwives' Registration Committee.
